Rhode Island Commerce is pleased to offer this written testimony in support of House Bill 7424, an Act Relating to Commercial Law – General Regulatory Provisions – Filing of Assumed Name.

HB 7424 mandates that individuals must apply for a trade name certificate with the Secretary of State's office, creating a clear and easily understandable framework for compliance. This bill would improve the process of registering business trade names in Rhode Island, helping to promote a business-friendly environment by ensuring clarity, efficiency, and compliance in this area. The centralization of the business and trade name registration process with the Secretary of State — compared to the current decentralization among various city and town clerks — will improve the ease of doing business as well as make it easier for public and private entities to validate the identity of businesses with trade names.
