RE: HB8190 Support

Chairman McNamara and Members of the House Education Committee:

As the CEO of Tides Family Services, I respectfully submit the following written testimony:

I am writing to support **House Bill 8190 Attendance For Success Act.** This establishes the "Attendance for Success Act" which focuses on student attendance in schools with an emphasis on chronically absent students.

Tides Family Services provides a multitude of critical community-based child welfare, juvenile justice, and behavioral health programs for children and families throughout the entire State. We bring a broad perspective based on over 40 years of providing services to children and families in Rhode Island.

Tides Family Services completed a data report based on a total of 309 clients who had "truancy" as one of their referral reasons during 2023. Highlights from this report are as follows:

- Only 2% of TFS truancy clients attend a school without a chronic absenteeism problem.
- The Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE) score was 65% of clients in treatment for truancy had two or more ACEs compared with 20% of Rhode Island children.
- Many of our truancy clients have a mental health diagnosis that could impact chronic absenteeism: 43% have PTSD or another adjustment disorder, 21% have ADHD diagnosis, and 15% have a social phobia or anxiety.
 - o Only 34% of clients reported having an IEP or 504 plan.

Tides Family Services client voices regarding chronic absenteeism:

- "Client is experiencing stress related to anxiety about school and other issues going on in her life."
- "When I was home with my parents, I wasn't able to go to school. They would keep me up all night and I would miss a lot of school."
- "There was a falling out with her previous friend group that occurred in the last 6 months and that has led to a significant decrease in her wanting to leave and increase in her time at home."

Tides Family Services strongly urges you to pass HB 8190 legislation to improve attendance and therefore life-long trajectory of youth in the state.
