## RE: H 7440 An Act Relating to Fish and Wildlife – Lobsters and Other Crustaceans

Dear Chairman Bennett,

Thank you for providing the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) the opportunity to comment on H 7440, which would remove a statutory prohibition on the taking of blue crabs between sunset and sunrise. DEM supports this legislation.

Although more commonly associated with the Chesapeake Bay, blue crabs are also found in Rhode Island waters and are commercially and recreationally harvested. While DEM tracks commercial harvest, there is no recreational harvest reporting metric, and thus total recreational landings are largely unknown. Rhode Island currently has a statutory prohibition on taking blue crabs at nighttime, which is unique compared to our neighboring states of Massachusetts and Connecticut. By removing the statutory language, the DEM Division of Marine Fisheries will be able to fully regulate the blue crab recreational fishery and potentially allow nighttime harvesting to occur if they deem the population can support additional, nighttime harvest. This process would be consistent with existing management of many other types of recreational fisheries in Rhode Island and allows for a variety of factors - including public feedback, scientific advice, enforcement concerns, and socioeconomic considerations - to be considered as part of management decisions.
