RE: H 6108 An Act Relating to Agriculture and Forestry – Right to Farm

Dear Chairman Bennett.

Thank you for providing the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) the opportunity to comment on H 6108, which is intended to promote the ownership of backyard chickens. DEM supports this legislation with recommended amendments.

The ownership of backyard chickens is currently regulated at the local level with varying ordinances in place in communities across the state. H 6108 would allow the ownership of backyard chickens statewide and would set minimum regulatory requirements that municipalities would be able to tighten at their discretion. The bill would prohibit ownership of roosters, regulate the number of hens allowed based on total lot area and not exceed ten hens, and set standards for the enclosure that the chickens are kept in.

DEM has two technical comments related to the language of this legislation. First, we recommend that the language in subsection (a) of the bill be amended to clarify that its provisions apply only to the keeping of domestic chickens and that it is not intended to prohibit or otherwise limit the commercial slaughter or sale of any chickens where otherwise allowed. Second, we recommend that the preemption language found in subsection (m) of the bill be amended to more clearly state that ownership of backyard chickens is allowed statewide, but that municipalities retain the ability to more stringently regulate the practice than the bill provides.
