RE: In support of HJR7771 - A Joint Resolution Making an Appropriation of \$500,000 to the Rhode Island School for Progressive Education for the Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Dear Chair Abney,

I write to express my support for House Resolution 7771, legislation that will make an appropriation of \$500,000 to the Rhode Island School of Progressive Education (RISPE) for the Fiscal Year 2024 to 2025.

As a former history and civics teacher for nearly 30 years, I am well aware of the discrepancies in our current education system and how these inequities impact the success of students in their future careers and civic lives. Several studies have highlighted the positive impact teachers of color have in the classroom and how all students, especially students of color, benefit from these educators throughout their academic journeys. For example, a 2021 University of Maryland study determined that teachers of color have large and lasting effects on the social-emotional, academic, and behavioral outcomes of their students regardless of the student's race or ethnicity.

The strategic goal that guides the work at RISPE is to improve outcomes for all students in Rhode Island's urban public schools. RISPE has programs for education providers to help address the lack of teachers of color and the need for more culturally competent educators. RISPE is committed to transforming teacher education in Rhode Island through high-quality, culturally competent, anti-racist teacher training with an explicit focus on creating a pipeline of teachers of color for our state's urban public schools.

I urge this Committee to support House Resolution 7771 and invest in RISPE, as their leadership in our state's urban educational infrastructure will help our most vulnerable and neglected students who will have a greater opportunity to reach their full potential and academic success.
