RE: H.8133, An Act Relating to Taxation - Sales and Use Taxes - Liability and Computation

Dear Chairman Abney and Committee Members,

The undersigned members of the Rhode Island Business Coalition oppose the passage of H.8133, An Act Relating to Taxation – Sales and Use Taxes – Liability and Computation

H.8133 levies an additional local hotel tax in the city of Newport, at a rate of 2.5% to be retained and used for Newport's public infrastructure and resiliency efforts. While this request is coming from the city of Newport, we believe the other 38 cities and towns will likely request the same authorization should this proposal move forward.

Rhode Island currently has the 13th highest real property rates in the country. Prior to the General Assembly's passage of tangible property tax reform, over half of the cities and towns had a higher tangible property tax rate than their residential property tax rate. We are concerned that passage of a law that allows cities and towns to implement a new local tax will lead down a slippery slope to challenges that will later have to be addressed by the General Assembly.

For these reasons, we ask you to oppose the passage of H.8133. Thank you for your consideration.
