RE: In support of H7036, An Act Relating to Education – The Education Equity and Property Tax Relief Act

Dear Chair Abney,

I am writing in support of House Bill 7036, legislation requesting funding for effective civics education instruction in every school district across the state.

As Secretary of State, one of my top priorities has been to expand the Department of State's civic education programming by establishing partnerships with middle and high schools across the state, including classroom visits, mock elections, and the Civic Liaison Program for students. These programs aim to encourage greater civic engagement among our state's youth.

We know that action-civics projects where students put their knowledge into action are how they learn best. Subsequently, this helps inform their participation in their respective communities going forward, enhancing their potential lifelong civic engagement. This legislation will specifically provide funding for teacher professional development in civics, the creation of a civic education curriculum, and support for the implementation of student-led civic projects.

As a former history and civics history teacher for over 30 years, I know how crucial it is to educate our students on both our history and how to participate in our democracy. Our youth should be engaged in our democratic processes and should have the opportunity to participate fully when at all available.

All young people deserve meaningful civic engagement and professional development that provides them with an array of knowledge, skills, and experiences. Therefore, I urge this committee to support the funding request proposed in House Bill 7036, as it will ensure that our teachers have the tools they need to implement civics in their curriculums and will provide students the support they need to be civically engaged.
