





# **CCRI VOLUNTARY RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PLAN**

A strategic step to align budget and workforce need in response to lower enrollment.

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### **Plan Design and Eligibility**

- Faculty and non-classified staff in good standing
- One-time only payment of 50% of participants current salary
- Combination of age and years of service of 80 or greater.
- Minimum of 55 years old
- Minimum of 10 years of service at CCRI
- Retirement date of June 14, 2025






## FRESH START SCHOLARSHIP

## **Expanding Eligibility to Credit-Bearing Credentials**

- Increases access to short-term, highvalue credentials that lead to jobs Supports students seeking stackable
