As part of our service array, FSRI provides supports to victims of crime through our nationally recognized and award-winning Go Team™. Through this innovative program, FSRI partners local police departments across the state, in addition to the RI State police, to provide immediate, on-scene services to victims of crime, especially when children are present, in order to mitigate the impacts of trauma. As a result of our Go Team™ programming, FSRI collaborates closely with the General Treasurer's office through their Crime Victim Compensation Program. This program is a valuable tool in helping innocent victims cover the financial cost of crime, and we especially appreciate the Treasurer's priority in making this program more accessible for victims of crime.

We also fully support the Treasurer Diossa's priority to implement Baby Bonds. This initiative is an important tool in helping to close the generation wealth gap in our state by creating a trust for every child born into a family receiving Medicaid, while also promote economic development by allowing that child, once they turn 18, to use the trust money for their future in the state through education, home ownership, starting a business, or purchasing a car.
