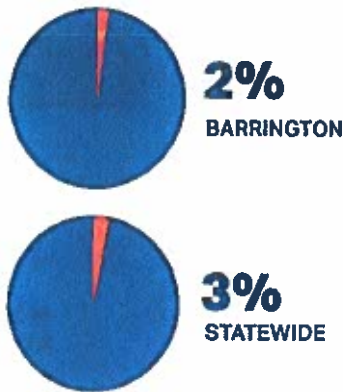

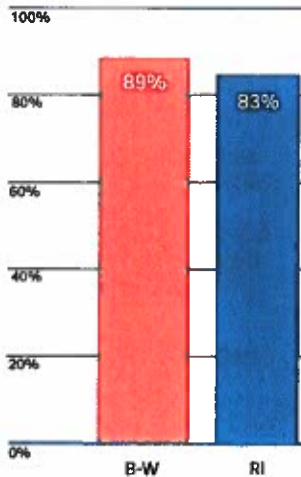

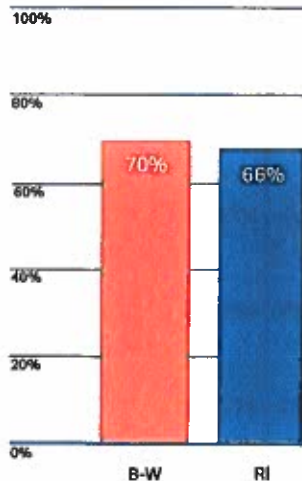

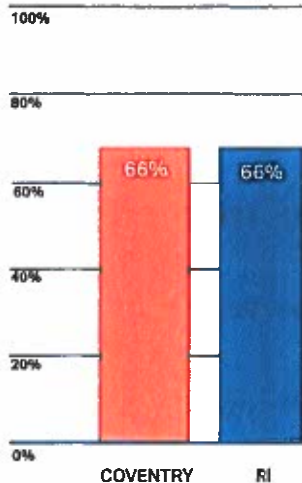

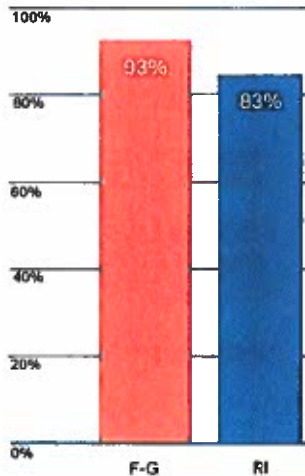

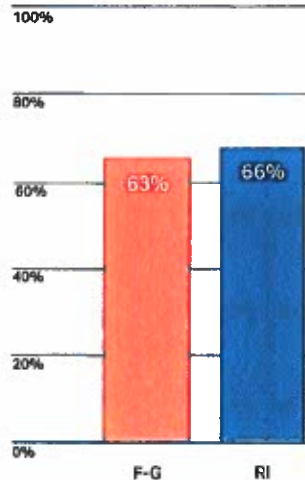

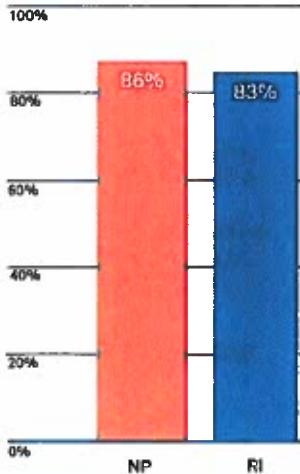

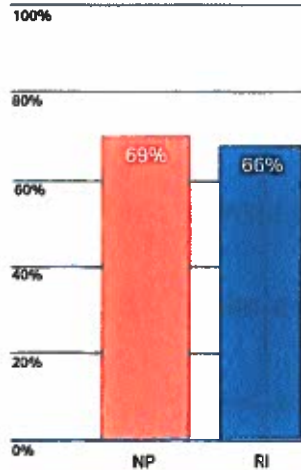

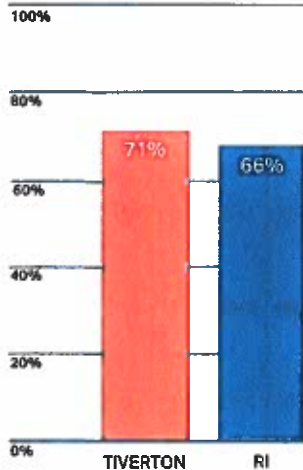

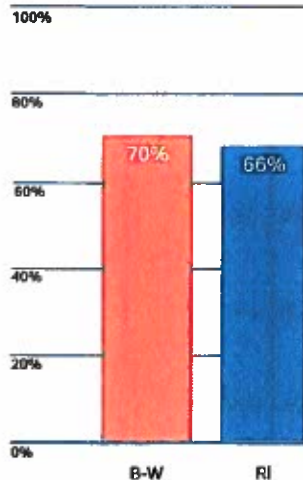

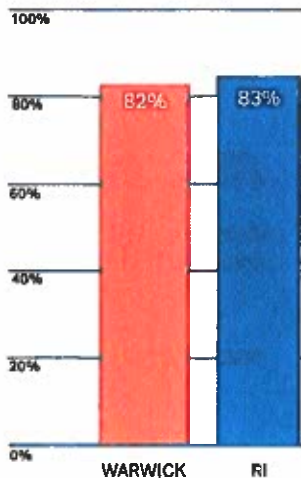

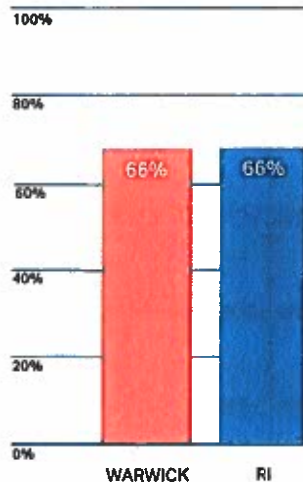

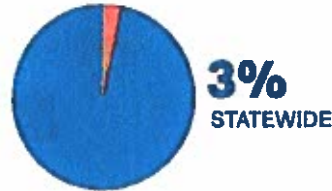
FAFSA COMPLETION RATES³

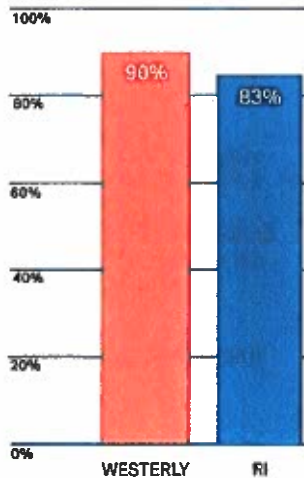

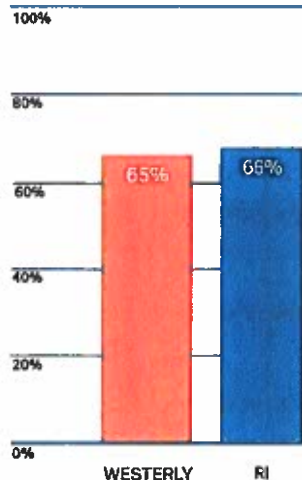

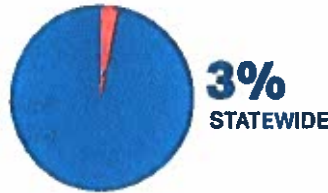
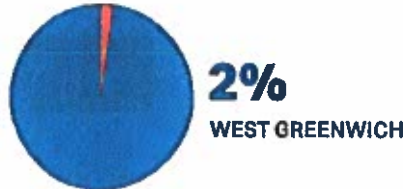
FAFSA COMPLETION RATES³

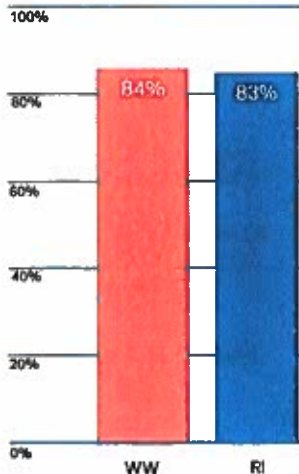

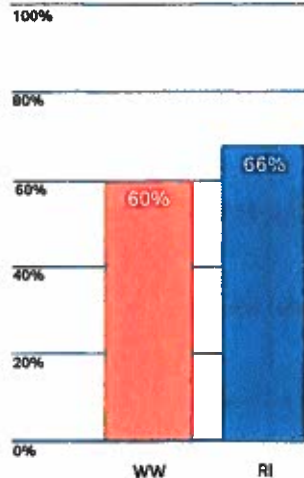

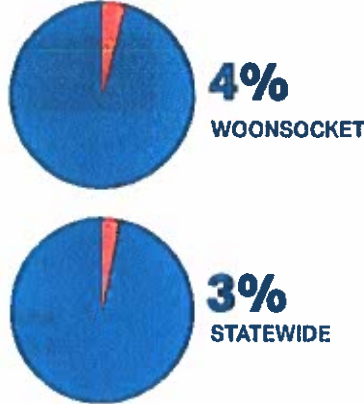

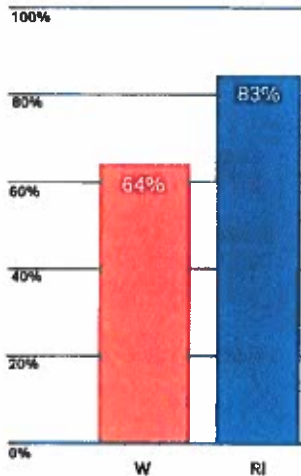

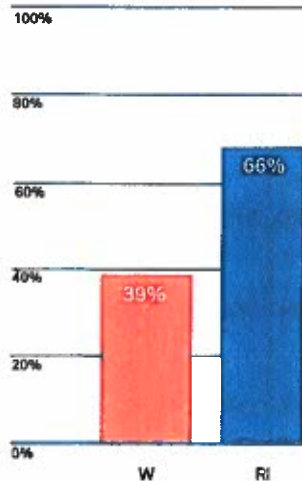
