Re: **Testimony SUPPORTING House Bill 7733**, creating the nursing home workforce standards board act to establish and enforce industry-wide quality of care standards in nursing homes.

Dear Chair Donovan and Honorable Committee Members,

Thank you for the opportunity to submit this testimony in support of House Bill 7733.

Advocates for Better Care in Rhode Island represents the rights and interests of residents of long-term care facilities in RI, and works towards resident empowerment, improved care, and an improved quality of life for residents. We profess no expertise in labor matters, but we do know this:

- There is a crisis of poor care, unsafe staffing levels, and poverty-inducing wages in RI nursing homes.
- Resident care is improved when staff earn a living wage.
- Resident care is improved when there are adequate numbers of well-trained direct care staff with adequate supervision.
- Some independent and non-profit facility owners/administrators prioritize resident care and staff support, and some struggle financially.
- Some for-profit facility owners cut every corner, hide massive profits, engage in wage theft and Medicare fraud, file for receivership under false pretenses, or otherwise cheat residents, staff, and taxpayers.
- The Workforce Standards Board is currently our best hope for bringing all stakeholders to the table to achieve sustainable solutions in wages, staffing, staff support, and training that will ultimately improve care and quality of life for Rhode Island's vulnerable nursing home residents.

For these reasons, we urge you to support H7733.
