RE: H.7103, An Act Relating to Commercial Law – General Regulatory Provisions – Deceptive Trade Practices

Dear Chairman Craven and Committee Members,

The undersigned members of the Rhode Island Business Coalition support the passage of H.7103, An Act Relating to Commercial Law – General Regulatory Provisions – Deceptive Trade Practices.

The bill eliminates medical debt, and transactions between a health care provider and a consumer, from credit reports. H.7103 limits interest on judgments related to medical debt to three percent (3%) instead of the current rate of twelve percent (12%). Lastly, the legislation bars executions and attachments on an individual's primary residence, as well as wage garnishments, if the judgment was related to a medical debt.

From a business perspective, we believe this bill is well thought out and beneficial. Companies do not want to make hiring decisions on credit reports utilizing medical debt. It provides a false narrative of the applicant as medical debt is usually not a matter of choice and is outside the individual's control.

We urge the committee to recommend passage of H.7103. Thank you for your consideration.
