Re: **Public Libraries – Affirmative Defense** Testimony in **support** of 2024 H 7575 (Morales, et al.)

The Rhode Island Federation of Teachers and Health Professionals supports H 7575. We represent librarians and library aides in public schools and in higher education institutions protected by this legislation.

Rhode Island is one of a handful of states that does not specifically protect librarians and other employees from charges under state obscenity laws. Forty-four states have some type of protection from prosecution for certain professions or types of workplaces. Thirty-one of those states specifically protect librarians from prosecution when working under the scope of their professional responsibilities. Rhode Island is not among the forty-four states that provides some protection from prosecution.

It is concerning that three states weakened their protections last year. It is more concerning that Rhode Island offers no protection in the first place.

There is a growing political controversary surrounding obscenity. We support efforts to protect employees from unjust prosecution and support enacting legislation as proposed by Representative Morales.
