Dear Chairman Craven and Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

I write to comment on 2025-H 5222, which amends the *Exclusive Jurisdiction* of the Family Court under R.I.G.L. 14—1-5, which details the exclusive original jurisdiction of the R.I. Family Court. It adds a subdivision to R.I.G.L. 14-1-28, regarding the mandatory transfer of cases to the Family Court. It is difficult to reconcile concurrent jurisdiction with the federal court at the discretion of the U.S. Attorney or the federal court with the exclusive original jurisdiction of the R.I. Family Court according to R.I.G.L. 14-1-28.

Moreover, even if this issue was clarified, the explanation provided by the Legislative Council does not match the language in the bill. The bill itself does not state that it applies only to minors who reside on the base. Obviously, the base could be breached and crimes committed by juveniles who live elsewhere. In addition, it is unclear whether a juvenile, once waived by the federal court or the U.S. Attorney is waived for all subsequent crimes, including wayward offenses, such as shoplifting in the Commissary.

Accordingly, the Court asks that this bill be held for further study.
