Chair Craven and Members of the Committee,

I am writing today in support of H5502 which would further delineate the definitions of felony, misdemeanor and petty misdemeanor.

This bill clarifies that a sentence for a misdemeanor in RI is 364 days. The current language states that these charges can carry a term "**not exceeding one year**".

Because of the overlap between federal and RI laws, someone can be deported for a crime that is a misdemeanor but, unfortunately, carries a sentence of up to one year. By changing the sentence a misdemeanor can carry to a maximum of 364 days, we can avoid the overlap between the state law and federal deportional law.

This law will have a huge impact and I urge you to pass it out of committee and send it to the floor for a vote.
