RE: Bill Number: 8077 AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC PROPERTY AND WORKS -- MANAGEMENT AND DISPOSAL OF PROPERTY

Dear Chairman Casey and Honorable Members of the House Municipal Government and Housing Committee:

I am writing to express our support for House Bill 8077, which seeks to prohibit any state-chartered fire district from liquidating or disposing of real or tangible property without first offering the property to the municipality in which the fire district is located.
