Re: 2025 - H - 5953, An Act Relating to Military Affairs and Defense – Emergency Management

Dear Chair Casey:

2025 – H - 5953, An Act Relating to Military Affairs and Defense – Emergency Management, requires the Director of the Rhode Island Emergency Management Agency (RIEMA) to issue warming and cooling center alerts when the National Weather Service predicts specific temperatures and weather conditions in any city or town in the state, and to coordinate with cities and towns in providing information regarding available services on its webpage, and with local media, social media channels, and United Way's 211. Upon the issuance of an alert, municipalities are required to arrange for and maintain the shelters.

RIEMA, the Rhode Island Department of Health, and the Rhode Island Department of Housing already have a severe weather alert and shelter plan in place. Under this plan, RIEMA provides support to and disseminates information on the locations of these shelters. In contrast to the proposed legislation, this plan is scalable, flexible, and fluid, and can be swiftly adjusted to accommodate changing situations.
