The holiday's current name has felt exclusionary to me as a member of the Asian American community. I can only imagine how painful and traumatic it must be for Japanese American members of the community.

The name change to "Peace and Remembrance Day" would be a first step towards promoting respect and inclusion for all Rhode Island residents, especially those of Asian descent. I am confident that renaming the holiday will be a meaningful step toward promoting respect, inclusion, and healing for all Rhode Island residents. I look forward to seeing Bill H.7326 become law and its positive effects on our state.
