## Background

The Central Collections Unit ("CCU") was established within the Department of Revenue by the General Assembly through Rhode Island Gen. Laws § 42-142-8, effective July 1, 2018, for the purpose of assisting state agencies in the collection of delinquent debts. These debts are made up of unpaid fines, fees, penalties, restitution, invoices, statements, plus unpaid wages due from private entities to their former employees for violations of state wage laws -all of which have been levied upon individuals and entities by Rhode Island state agencies. CCU assists state agencies in the collection of these delinquent debts owed to the state utilizing the most efficient collection methods and adhering to the highest professional standards.

Pursuant to Rhode Island Gen. Laws § 42-142-8(p), the Department of Revenue shall "assess the performance, effectiveness, and revenue impact of the collections associated with [the Central Collections Unit] including, but not limited to, the total amounts referred and collected by [or on behalf of] each referring agency during the previous state fiscal year.



#### RITT – Outside collection services

How much, if any, of Traffic Tribunal receivables have previously been referred to outside collection services? In researching a response to this question, the CCU has spoken to representatives of the RITT, the Supreme Court Administrator and the Supreme Court's Assistant Administrator for Finance and Budget.

- The Traffic Tribunal was established in 1999, pursuant to Rhode Island Gen. Laws Chapter 8-8.2
- The Traffic Tribunal, as currently constituted, has never retained an outside collection agency and the referrals recently made to the CCU are the first time the Traffic Tribunal has referred its debts to an outside entity for collection
- · The Administrative Adjudicative Court was extinguished in 1999
- The Supreme Court's Assistant Administrator for Finance and Budget recalls that the Administrative Adjudicative Court retained an
  outside collection agency many years ago, but there is no documentation that can be found concerning any interactions between the
  Administrative Adjudicative Court and that collection agency
