
## Division of Agriculture and Forest Environment

The newly merged Division created new synergies and partnerships in program deliverables on environmental health and safety issues.


Siloed expertise has bled into various program areas to extend knowledge and assist staff.

#### **Forest Environment All Staff**







### 2020 Forest Action Plan



- 1. Establishes a vision for the management of RI's forest resources.
- 2. Provides goals, policies, and strategies focused on the management of tree resources.
- 3. Intended to advance local stewardship towards the twin goals of a healthy, sustainable forest economy and forest environment.



- 1. Manage 40,000 + acres of forestland within Mgmt. Areas ~ Operation & Maintenance of 6% of the state's land area through Recreation and Woodland Management
- 2. Coordinates a statewide forest fire protection plan, and; provide forest fire protection on state lands, assists rural volunteer fire departments

- 3. Promote understanding of environmental conservation and assist the Feds in providing landowner assistance programs.
- 4. Monitor and recommend controls for insects and disease, work with communities promoting urban tree health, to license arborists, and to certify forest land under the state's Farm, Forest and Open Space Act.



## Forest Conservation Need



Current Rhode Island laws do not provide protection for forestland (apart from existing wetland protection laws)

### 2021 - Forest Conservation Act

The general assembly recognizes that RI forest land has many important values, and that forest land should be maintained to meet Rhode Island's aggressive climate change goals through carbon sequestration and storage.

Core forest land and connecting natural areas should be conserved to prevent ongoing fragmentation of the state's forests.

It is in the best interest of...the state to identify and acquire the development rights to core and unfragmented forests so as to maintain these important forest values.


















## **Timber Stand Improvements**





For forest health management and wildlife habitat projects at state management areas. Rhode Island's forests and trees may seem like a green backdrop to our landscape, but they are in fact hard at work generating a wide range of services and values. Forests are a place where humans and native wildlife can live and thrive by providing habitats for animals and livelihoods for humans. They also offer watershed protection, prevent soil erosion, purify our air, clean our water, and mitigate climate change.

## Forest Fire Program







#### **Purpose:**

To use pass-through federal funding to provide financial, technical and related assistance to rural fire departments to prevent and suppress rural fires and enhance protection capabilities (training, equipment).

Supports wildland urban interface issues and meeting the needs of communities at risk. Issues and needs include firefighter safety and training, enhancing community water supply and delivery capabilities, communications, and equipping.

#### **Eligibility**:

Local fire departments in communities with populations of 10,000 or less.

FY 23 Grant Funds - \$35,000 - 17 Grants



# Forest Fire Program Education and Outreach

Classes and workshops including wildfire attack, chainsaw safety, preplan/incident response, wildfire behavior, single resource boss, and advance leadership

#### National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) curriculum









# Forest Fire Program Education and Outreach

**Firewise Program** – A national program adopted by DFE to help residents protect property from uncontrolled wildfire.

**Community Wildfire Protection Plan** - used to identify priority areas for fuels reduction treatments and recommend treatment methods









# Forest Fire Program State Land Management

## Prescribed Fire 2023

4 Burns – 49 total acres
Pratt Farm, Exeter | Nicolas Farm, Coventry

#### **Shaded Fuel Break Activity**

1 shaded fuel break implemented at GW Management Area Proof of concept and demonstration site Approx ½ mile long

1 shaded fuel break planned in Arcadia Management Area planned 1 mile long

# Forest Fire Program Wildfire Response

#### 2021 Year in Review

#### Fires:

101 fires, 178.1 acres burned (average side 1.76 acres)

Largest fire – 52 acres

Residences threatened – 32

damaged – 4

Outbuildings threatened – 21

damaged – 2

**Injures** requiring transport – 3

**Bags of hose** – 342 - 102,600 ft (19.4 miles)



## Wildfire Response (Continued)

## RHODE ISLAND DIVISION AND POREST ENVIRONMENT

#### **Before A Fire**

- Preplanning
- Train municipal fire department and other agencies in wildland fire topics

#### **Fire Response:**

DFE hears the 911 radio tone for a report of a wildland fire

- Self dispatch if the radio traffic sounds like a large or complex fire
   -OR-
- DFE may call the responding Municipal fire department via cell phone and ask "if and what kind of assistance is needed?"
   OR-
- DFE may get a "cold call" from a municipal fire department or dispatch center requesting a response

#### On Scene

- We integrate with the responding party
- We fill needed roles whatever they are-firefighter up to command staff
- We help make decisions on fire suppression strategy

#### **After The Fire**

- We compile reporting
- We service the hose



Well-managed, healthy forests, require management, planning, best management practices, whether on state-owned and managed land, or on private lands and benefits residents, wildlife, watersheds, municipalities and Narragansett Bay.
