**Subject:** Amendments to FY 2022 Appropriations Act (21-H-6122)

The Governor requests that an amendment be made to the FY 2022 Appropriations Act in support of the State's compliance requirements under the Department of Justice Developmental Disabilities Program Consent Decree. The amendments include changes to the appropriation amounts in Article 1, Relating to Making Appropriations in Support of FY 2022. A corresponding Governor Budget article amendment associated with this initiative is being submitted under separate cover. A description of the amendments requested is provided below.

# ARTICLE 1, RELATING TO MAKING APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2022 SECTION 1, APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2022

#### Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities, and Hospitals

<u>Increase General Revenues in the Services for the Developmentally Disabled program, Page 17, Line 26 by \$7,780,499 from \$131,509,888 to \$139,290,387.</u>

<u>Increase Federal Funds in the Services for the Developmentally Disabled program, Page 18, Line 10 by</u> \$18,964,880 from \$162,482,756 to \$181,447,636.

The Governor requests a budget amendment which continues the work of Consent Decree compliance and recommends a repurposing of \$13.0M all funds originally recommended to finance a transformation and transition fund for DD providers with a rate increase to support a direct support professional (DSP) wage increase effective upon passage. This investment will seek to raise the average estimated DSP wage amongst current Developmental Disability Organizations (DDOs) to at least \$15.75, raise the average estimated wage of direct care overnight professionals to the minimum wage of \$12.25 and raise the estimated average wage of supervisors in the appropriate scale to the new wage of supervisees (average estimated wage of \$21.99). The proposal will allow Rhode Island DSP wages to be competitive with bordering states. It should be noted that this rate increase is not reflective of an exact wage of a DSP as the wages are determined by providers. A total of \$2.0M all funds of the original transformation and transition fund will be retained to invest in state infrastructure to ensure continued progress in meeting the most recent Consent Decree requirements of the DD program. A corresponding Governor Budget article amendment associated with this budget amendment was submitted under separate cover (22-BHDDH1).
